

WHEREAS, On March 24, 1992, A Republic Act (R.A.) No. 7279 was approved by the Congress entitled "AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR A COMPREHENSIVE AND INTEGRATED SHELTER AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT FINANCING PROGRAM BY INCRAISING AND REGULARIZING THE ACT PROVIDING FOR A COMPREHENSIVE AND INTEGRATED SHELTER AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT FINANCING PROGRAM BY INCRAISING AND REGULARIZING THE NATIONAL HOME MORTGAGE CORPORATION (NHMFC) AND THE HOME INSURANCE AND GUARANTY CORPORATION (HIGC), IDENTIFYING OTHER SOURCES OF FUNDING AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSES", which created the National Home Mortgage Corporation (NHMFC) and the Home Insurance and Guaranty Corporation (HIGC), and for other purposes; and

WHEREAS, On December 16, 1994, R.A. 7835 was approved by Congress entitled "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE AUTORIZING THE ABOT-KAYA PABAHAY FUND UNDER REPUBLIC ACT NO. 6846, AUGMENTING THE ABOT-KAYA PABAHAY FUND CAPITAL STOCK AND PAID-UP CAPITAL OF THE NATIONAL HOME MORTGAGE FINANCE CORPORATION (NHMFC) AND THE HOME INSURANCE AND GUARANTY CORPORATION (HIGC), IDENTIFYING OTHER SOURCES OF FUNDING AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSES", which increased the capital stock of the National Home Mortgage Corporation (NHMFC) and the Home Insurance and Guaranty Corporation (HIGC) and for other purposes; and

WHEREAS, most of the members of the Homeowners Associations coming from the social housing programs of the government are from the low-income families, poor, underprivileged and homeless citizens;

WHEREAS, On January 20, 2004, then President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo issued Executive Order (E.O.) WHEREAS, the grantees of the social housing programs of the government are paying monthly amortization for the house and lot aside from providing food and other basic commodities to their families, and most of them do not have the capacity to contribute to their homeowner's association for the construction of infrastructure projects for the convenience of their community;

WHEREAS, during the public hearing for this ordinance it was suggested that community housing associations whose members acquired their house and lot through direct purchase, donation and free patents shall be included as beneficiaries for this ordinance;

NOW THEREFORE, be it enacted as it is hereby enacted by the City Council of Bacolod City, by virtue of the powers vested in it by law, in a session duly assembled, that:

SECTION 1.-DEFINITION OF TERMS:

1. Direct Purchase- Buying of house and lot directly from the seller instead of going through a third party;
2. Donation- is an act of liberality whereby a person disposes gratuitously of a thing or right in favor of another, who accepts it;
3. Free patent- land grants awarded by the government to natural born Filipino citizens in actual occupation and cultivation of the lot they are actually occupying in accordance with law;
4. Community Housing Program- Program of the government the purpose of which is to assist legally-organized associations of underprivileged and homeless citizens to purchase and develop a tract of land and to own lots they occupy or where they choose to relocate to, under the concept of community ownership.

SECTION 2. - IDENTIFICATION:

The Federation of Homeowners Association, Incorporated (FEDHOA), as the existing accredited Homeowners Association, in coordination with the City Mayor's Office (CMO) shall identify the list of homeowner's associations coming from the different community housing associations whose members acquired their house and lot through direct purchase, donation, free patent, Community Housing Program of the government or other analogous acquisitions which shall be the beneficiaries of this ordinance;

SECTION 3. - INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS:

The funds appropriated shall be used for infrastructure projects which shall include but not limited to:

1. Bridges
2. Foot walks
3. Multi-purpose Halls
4. Parks

SECTION 6. - IMPLEMENTATION:

The beneficiaries shall submit to the City Mayor's Office (CMO) an accomplishment report of the infrastructure projects granted to them by virtue of this ordinance.

SECTION 5. - ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT:

An amount of Five Million Pesos (\$5,000,000.00) every year is hereby mandated to be appropriated for the effective implementation of this ordinance;

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
