### **Vision**

A barangay where the barangay officials provide and honest and transparent leadership; where peace, harmony and unity of the people and the barangay officials is maintained to achieve development and progress for the greatest good of our barangay constituents.

### **Mission**

To see Barangay Cabug as one of the beautiful and progressive rural barangays of Bacolod City. A barangay where men, women, children, youths, elderly, the disabled, and those who are distressed can have access to basic social, economic and infrastructure services.

### **Historical Background**

It was in 1961 when Barangay Cabug was chartered as a barangay of Bacolod City by virtue of Republic Act enacted by the Philippine Congress. Before its charter, it was only a sitio which is part of Barangay Sum-ag with the sitios of Punta Taytay and Pahanocoy.

During the early times, the place is predominantly swamps. The local folks claimed to have noticed numerous bats or “cabug” in the place. It is a kind of a bird yet categorized as a mammal which only appeared during the night and known to have possessed extra-ordinary sense of sight in the dark. It hide during the day for it cannot stand in the brightness of daylight. It fed itself of fruits and wild fruit trees and shrubs. Because of its obvious number, the place was called Sitio Cabug.

Cipriano Malayang or “Tio Panoy” was the first Teniente del Barrio. There were only few families who lived in the place then. To specially mention, the families of Ciriaco Relota, Daniel Ruiz, Cesar Ilon, Arsenio Magallanes, Ricardo Endonila, Tomas Magalona, among others. Almost of the families came from few clans, that is why everyone knows everybody. To these days, nobody from among the natives still survived, yet their children and grandchildren could tell the story of how those families supported Cipriano Malayang and the very hard times they encounter to properly represent their voice to the local and national government for the place to be recognized as an independent barangay.

Finally, their efforts bore its fruit when Sitio Cabug was chartered as a Barangay in January 1961. From then on the barangay was slowly taking its shape. The temporary school building made of nipa leaves and bamboo groves was constructed near the home of Teniente del Barrio Cipriano Malayang. Later, the late Don Iluminado Nessia, Sr. or “Tio Nadong” donated a portion of his land as site to the proposed school building to encourage the local government to construct access roads to the national highway. And so it was done. The present elementary school who have so far produced countless of professionals bore the name of the donor for his generosity.

Cipriano Malayang, with the untiring support of his constituents facilitated for the construction of the elementary school as the Cubay Primary School which is its previous name, the road connection Barangay Cabug to the Cegasco road and the barangay road.

In 1968, Nicasio Malayang was elected as the next Teniente del Barrio. During his term, he facilitated for the construction of the Cabug bridge or the “Taytay Cabug”.

Emmanuel Malayang, the son of Tio Panoy Malayang became the third Punong Barangay in 1972. When Martial Law was declared, the barangay assemblies were organized throughout the country. Presidential Decree No. 86-A was issued as guidelines for its functions and organizations. Since then, the heads of the barangays were called Barangay Captain.

Mr. Emmanuel Malayang served for 22 years (1972 – 1994), the longest term ever served by a Barangay Captain in the city of Bacolod. During his term, he and the rest of the members of the Barangay Council were able to facilitate for the construction and establishment of the Barangay site in 1978. Barangay electrification in the early 80’s, construction of Barangay Hall, Children’s Park, Day Care Center, stage and basketball court and for the initial concreting of barangay roads. Our children’s park have long been recognized for its well-planned structures and shady trees around it.

In 1994, Atty. Iluminado Nessia, Jr. became the next Barangay Captain. During his term, he facilitated for the complete concreting of the barangay road and the road connecting the circumferential road. The family have also donated another site besides the Don I. Nessia, Sr. Elementary School as the site to the Sum-ag National High School – Cabug Extension, and now named as Rufina Nessia National High School –Sum-ag Extension; and for the operational of the Fray Luis Amigo Health Center

run by the Capuchin Tertiary Sisters. The barangay market was also constructed during his term. He also led in the tree planting activity in the thoroughfares of the barangay which now have provided sufficient shades to the passers-by.

Riboni M. de Paula became the next Punong Barangay in 1997 – 2010. During his term, he facilitated for the construction of barangay gym and stage, multi-purpose hall, the 2- storey barangay hall, 2 units of water system, day care center in Purok Lechonan, water tank and handpumps at the different puroks, multi-purpose court at Purok Torrecampo, development of plaza; electrification at various puroks.

During his term, Barangay Cabug was awarded as the Cleanest and Park in 1997, Best barangay in 1998, 2<sup>nd</sup> prize in the Inter-Barangay Clean and Green contest in 2000; 3<sup>rd</sup> prize in the Child Friendly Barangay in 2000; 1<sup>st</sup> prize in the Inter barangay Clean and Green contest in 2001; 1<sup>st</sup> prize in the Christmas Belen contest sponsored by DMBZ-DYEZ and the city government in 2002; Sandugo Outstanding Local Government Executive Awardee in 2009; Champion in the Electric Maskara Float Competition in 2010.

Riboni de Paula was the proponent of the Lechon Festival held every second week of January in the celebration of our barangay charter anniversary and this made barangay Cabug a very well known to other places.

Our barangay officials then and now did their share in the proper implementation of progress and projects due to the constituents.

## Demographic Features

Barangay Cabug is located more or less ten (10 kilometers south of Bacolod. Bounded on the north by Brgy. Tabunan, Bago City; on the south by Brgy. Tangub; on the Southwest by Brgy. Pahanocoy; on the east by Brgy. Handumanan; on the northeast by Brgy. Felisa; on the west by Brgy. Sum-ag. It has a total land area of 897 hectares with a ratio of 5 inhabitants per hectare.

Based on the City Planning Office, Barangay Cabug is classified as residential area, agricultural area planted with sugarcane, rice and other food crops; and a light industrial barangay. Of the 897 hectares area, 865 hectares or 96% of this is agricultural land, the largest component of this is sugarcane land, which comprises the area of 830 hectares or 93%. Sugarcane makes up the largest portion of the barangay and is considered as the most common livelihood of the populace. Aside from sugarcane, rice is also planted and it occupies 30 hectares, the remaining is being planted with other agricultural crops, vegetables and fruit bearing trees. It is composed of the Cabug proper, Haciendas Sayson, Moya and Nessia. It is composed of 25 puroks which serve as the grassroots of barangay officials who help in the implementation of the barangay programs. The barangay proper is composed of 197 lots intended as barangay site. Houses in this area are mostly concrete. There are rough street roads that the people suffer especially during the rainy season. The people in the outskirt puroks have no permanent area and tenure of residency from their employer and lack of water supply (water facilities) for their daily needs.

**b. Health**



Our barangay health center offers good health services in order to produce a quality of healthy people. Health services in Barangay Cabug is undertaken by the City Health Office and is responsible for the formulation, planning and implementation of programs in the field of health. It offers medical consultation every Wednesday morning and pre-natal in the afternoon. A nurse and a Midwife who are serving daily and conducts immunization to children every Tuesday morning and supplemental feeding to 2<sup>nd</sup> degree malnourished children manned by the Barangay Nutrition Scholar and eight (8) Barangay Health Workers who assist in the health functions.

Being the adopted barangay of the Pediatric Assn. of Metro Bacolod, Pedia Doctors from CLMMRH conducts free medical consultation every Monday afternoon. There is also a Fray Luis Amigo Health Center – an institution managed by the Capuchin Sisters that offers medical consultation with a low charge every Monday to Friday morning only.

**f. Housing**

Barangay Cabug has five (5) hectares lot owned by the Jesena family intended as Barangay site in the barangay proper, the 3.5 hectares is comprised of 199 lots for houses and 1.5 hectares has been donated by the Jesena family to the barangay for road lots, parks and playgrounds and barangay facilities. Houses in this area are mostly concrete. People in the outskirts puroks and haciendas have no permanent area and tenure of residency from their employers. In the year 2010 GAWAD KALINGA HOUSING PROJECT was opened to 27 family beneficiaries and there are still more to come to avail of the housing for free.
