INTRODUCTION

Barangay Handumanan became the basic governmental unit in the nation's political structure on December 17, 1985. Presidential Decree No. 557 created Barangays to provide popular participation in shaping up public policy. All powers, functions, duties and responsibilities of barrios, assembly, councils and officials enumerated in the Revised Barrio Charter (RA 3590) was assimilated by the Barangay. Also on the same date, City Ordinance was created approving and adapting the recommended delineation of boundaries of sixty-one (61) Barangays in the City of Bacolod.

GENERAL BACKGROUND

In planning the total development of man, the provision of adequate shelter by way of providing small but affordable home lots was a priority of the National Government in early '70s. The City Government of Bacolod likewise felt such need. It culminated with the enactment of the Resolution No. 4107, Series of 1972, which created the office of the Bacolod Housing Authority (BHA). The office was tasked to administer, supervise and implement the Housing Development Program of the City.

The success of MRRP inspired our City Officials under the mayorship of Raymundo R. Dizon, Jr., to enter into a joint venture with the National Housing Authority (NHA) in 1977, for the establishment of a Pambansang Bagong Nayon Housing Project adjacent to MRRP, with an area of 12.5 hectares likewise owned by the Negros Economic Development Foundation. However, the complexities of such a program to provide house and lot to

low-income households compelled with the City Government to revise it into the now Mansilingan Sites and Services Project (MSSP). This involved the provision of 120 square meter minimum lots beneficiaries along with the development projects thru funds provided by the NHA and payable in 25 years.

In 1983, the city under the administration of Mayor Jose Y. Montalvo, Jr. acquired the adjoining 5 hectares lot from the Benares Family.

In late 1989, under the administration of Mayor Alfredo Montelibano, Jr. the 5 hectares lot aforesaid was developed on a phase basis to enter the needs of the dislocated squatters evicted by the various private owners and land government agencies to give rise to commercial, industrial and other growth centers in Bacolod City.

Today MRRP, MSSP and the developed portion of Phases III, IV, V, VIA and VIB has been achieved and served as the inspiration not only to the officials of various administration since 1972 up to the present, but more importantly to all the families who still dream of someday owning a lot they can call their own. In this undertaking, the MRRP people have already been given the privilege to buy their respective home lots. In fact to this day, almost all of the residents of MRRP and MSSP have already been issued the titles for their lots.

In 1984, the residents of MSSP-MRRP through their zone chairperson initiated a petition for separation of the community from Barangay Mansilingan. A series of consultations and negotiations took place. Recognizing the merit of such petition, the Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Bacolod on its December 17, 1985 Regular Session, passed City Ordinance No. 09, Series of 1985. "An Ordinance creating a new Barangay in the City of Bacolod to be known as Barangay Handumanan".

Pursuant to RA 3590 as amended by PD. 86 and 86- A all power vested in the barrios shall henceforth be exercised by strengthen and defining the role of the Barangay PD. 86-A that collect views of the people shall be considered in the formation of national policies and programs.

In 1986, during the Mayorship of then Atty. Amado "Remache" Parreño, Jr., the late Domingo Latergo was appointed Brgy. Captain who won the subsequent collegial elections in 1989 on a three-year term, from 1998, up to the year 2000. However, he met his untimely death last January 24, 1999. thereupon, he was succeeded by the first Councilman, Mr. Ricardo A. Danoy Sr. as Chief Executive of the Barangay.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

In the early 1970's, the City of Bacolod was faced with settlement problems caused by the high incidence of informal settlers who were occupying open spaces of both private and government-owned lands. Most of this settlers were displaced laborers in the sugar industry which at that year was beset by problems of low prices in the world market. These settlers came to Bacolod in the hope of finding employment and a better life.

The unexpected growth in population obscure the existing structure for delivery of services, particularly in the area of housing. Majority of the migrants (informal settlers) were unable to acquire home lots for themselves because of the very nature of their life circumstances, thus, these settlers put up makeshift structure that serve as dwelling places whatever they could find open space that is easily accessible to business centers.

Informal settlers continued to generate. The national government, realizing the hazards of these settlers that pose to health and safety prioritized programs such as housing needs focusing the provision of small but affordable home lots to low – income families.

Geographical Areas to be covered

Handumanan Relocation Site

It is located southeast of Bacolod with a distance of 7.3 km. radius from the City Hall. It was formerly part of Barangays Cabug, Felisa and Mansilingan and was created as a new Barangay in the City of Bacolod to be known as Barangay Handumanan as per City Ordinance No. 9 dated December 17, 1985. The project has an area of 95.04 hectares of agricultural land and was alter classified into a residential land. It covers six (6) phases.

Mansilingan Relocation and Rehabilitation Project (MRRP)

In Bacolod City, the local government also followed the same course of action. Mayor Carlos P. Benares created a special committee tasked to conduct a comprehensive study on relocation and resettlement program for the city. It was made possible with the mandate of Resolution No. 4107 Series of 1972, which created the office of the Bacolod Housing Authority (BHA). They are tasked to administer, supervise and implement the Housing Development Program of the City.

With this, Don Andres Soriano, Sr. donated a portion of his land to the Negros Economic development Foundation (NEDF) for the resettlement program. Architect Ramiro Garcia, Jr. head of the BHA acquired the lot of 16.3565 hectares. The lot was to be paid for a period of ten (10) years under a Lease Purchase Agreement.

The area was developed as a relocation site and named Mansilingan Relocation and Rehabilitation Project (MRRP)..

In 1974, the BHA opened the first six (6) zones of MRRP to a pioneering group of squatters from Riviera. A parcel of land ranging from 170 to 556 square meters was appointed by the City to each household who relocated to the area. Home lot with an area of 170 square meters were sold at P5.40 per square meter, those in excess cost a bit higher at P5.50. The cost of the lot was to be amortized over a 10-year period.

The community has also provisions for water facilities, road network, lighting, market, open spaces for sports activities, church and school facilities.

Following closely on the hills of the pioneers were squatters from Jalandon, North and South Capitol Road, Capitol Extension, Magsungay, Gatuslao-Hilado, Alunan, Storage, Burgos-Gatuslao, Banago, 6th Street, and City Heights. With the population fast increasing, the residents decided to get organized and in 1978 the Community Development Council came into being. The main objective of the Council was to serve as venue for the formulation of programs and activities that will meet the needs of the residents and likewise bring about development of the community. MRRP then was annexed to Barangay Mansilingan as Sitio Pinasahe, which is an Ilonggo term for "Unique".

Mansilingan Site and Services Project (MSSP)

The City Officials was encouraged and inspired for more projects with the success of the MRRP, which was under Mayor Raymundo R. Dizon, Jr., who succeeded Mayor Benares. The Bacolod City local government entered into a joint venture with the National Housing Authority (NHA) in 1977 under the BLISS Program for the establishment of the "Pambansang Bagong Nayon". Thus, the establishment of the extension of MRRP, which was named Mansilingan Sites and Services Project (MSSP). This project was supposed to have been implemented in 1978, however, there were complexities that hindered the construction that would provide bothhouse and lot for low income households of the City. The local government expanded the project coverage.

Under this site, the lots provided were much smaller with that of the MRRP. It only has 120 square meters. This site was funded by the NHA, which was payable for 25 years.

The local election in 1980 brought about the change in political leadership, under Mayor Jose Y. Montalvo. The Ministry of Human Settlements for the City of Bacolod and BHA work to acquire an adjoining site with an area of 50 hectares from the Benares Family for development into another relocation site under the MSSP. In 1981,, while negotiations for development of the area was under process, a monstrous fire razed almost the entire MALALUSAN (a low income community within the boundaries of Mabini, Lacson, Luzuriaga, and San Juan Streets). Even if development of MSSP was not yet completed, the City Government had no choice but relocate the fire victims of the site. The six (6) zones were opened in MSSP and a massive relocation of Informal Settlers took place. Aside from the MALALUSAN fire victims, some were from Old PC Compound, Singcang, Rizal-Hilado, Hervias, Airport, City Heights, Ceres, Mansilingan, Lopez Jaena, San Sebastian and Barangay 2, 11, 8 and 33. Additional phases were opened to accommodate more settlers, the homelots become smaller. Please see Table 1.1 for information on area home lots.

With the creation of MSSP, Sitio Pinasahe was alter named MRRP-MSSP, Barangay Mansilingan. With 12 zones to supervise, the BHA was kept on its toes formulating strategies for effective administration of the new community.

In 1984, the residents of MSSP-MRRP through their zone chairperson initiated a petition for separation of the community from Barangay Mansilingan. A series of consultations and negotiations took place. Recognizing the merit of such petition, the Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Bacolod on its December 17, 1985 Regular Session, passed City Ordinance No. 09, Series of 1985. "An Ordinance creating a new Barangay in the City of Bacolod to be known as Barangay Handumanan".

Towards the latter part of 1989, under the administration of Mayor Alfredo L. Montelibano, Jr., the hectares purchased on the Benares Family during the administration of Mayor Jose Y. Montalvo was developed on a phase basis to cater to the needs dislocated informal settlers evicted by the various private owners and government agencies, so as to make way for the development of commercial, industrial and other growth centers in Bacolod City.

In the early part of the 1990's the NEDF establish a Housing Cooperative Program for employees of NGO's and families coming from different barangays.

HISTORY OF HINUGYAW FESTIVAL

Year 1974, an ERA which served as the turning point in the lifestyles of the squatters in the different areas of the Bacolod city. a parcel of land ranging from 170sq meters to 300 square meters apportioned to them by the city of Bacolod complete with water, road network, lightings, open spaces for sports activities, church and school facilities. Then the Mansilingan Relocation and Rehabilitation Project was born In 1976, the community development council was organized to cater to the needs of the residents in terms of programs and activities deemed necessary for the existence of the community , MRRP was then annexed to barangay mansilingan.

In 1980, the ministry of human settlement and the Bacolod Housing Authority worked hand in hand to give birth to another relocation site known as the mansilingan site and services project. In 1983 brgy kagwad Reynaldo grandeza sr., the elder of the community, and the cdc obtained the consensus of the settlers, which culminated to the holding of the first MRRP-MSSP annual fiesta named after the patron Saint Familia Sagrada Holy Family, then, on december 17, 1985, the city of Bacolod passed city ordinance no. 09 series of 1985, creating a new barangay known as barangay handumanan.

In 1986, during the mayorship of then Remache Parreno Jr. the late Domingo Latergo was appointed Brgy. Captain which won the subsequent collegial elections in 1989 on a three year term, from 1998 up to the year 2000. However, he met his untimely death last January 24, 1999. There upon, he was succeeded by the first barangay kagawad, hon. Ricardo Danoy Sr., as chief executive of the barangay.

In the year 2000, handumanan was given the brand name **THE NEW FRONTIER** which means new hope and prosperity of the people and of the barangay itself through the effort of the Bacolod city tourism office and the office of tourism cultural development in coordination with the barangay officials of Handumanan.

In the year 2000, the barangay council hold its first historical festival which serve as precedence of further activities to bear the official name of the festival named "*hinugyaw*". It means happiness of the people in this barangay for obtaining the blessings from our almighty.

HINUGYAW Festival is manifested by signs of life like street dancing sports activities, and cultural presentations to showcase the willingness, talents and vigor of all the people in the barangay who are now grouped into as one nevertheless, they came from different barangays of Bacolod city.
