And for many years have passed the number of people grows as their sons and daughters in that place married each other and other sons and daughters married also the sons and daughters of other neighboring haciendas and as the time have passed it became a big neighbourhood which in their own dialect they call themselves magkasilingan hence Barangay Mansilingan got its name.

Among the 61 barangays comprising Bacolod City, Barangay Mansilingan was the most populous. Bounded on the East by Municipality of Murcia on the north by Brgy. Vista Alegre and on the East by Brgys. Taculing and Alijis and on the South brgys. Felisa and Handumanan.
