HISTORY OF THE BARANGAY

According to legend, an ex-captain of a ship bought a large tract of land in a place which is now known as Barangay Taculing. For sentimental reasons, he named his newly acquired property Taculin, in memory of his ship, Taculin. In this land area, wild grapes, which the natives called “Bicang” grew in abundance. Its ripe fruits were glossy and black, which they called “Tuling.” Because of this, the local people began calling the place Taculin or Taculing.

To eliminate the confusion and in deference to the wishes of the people, the Barangay Council of 1964-1968 passed a resolution officially calling the place Barangay Taculing. The resolution was a motion of Councilman Ivan Solidum duly seconded by Councilman Rodolfo Aspan.

The offices of the City Mayor, City Council, City Superintendent of Schools, City Treasurer, Division of Superintendent of Schools of Negros Occidental and the Secretary of Education of Manila were each furnished a copy of the resolution.

Since then, our Barangay has been legitimately called, Barangay Taculing.
