BARANGAY TANGUB HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

A story starts down from the early residents of the Barangay about how this place got its name. Long, ago the Barangay was covered with thick forest with wild animals and birds. One day while the villages were having their noonday rest in their cogon huts, they heard an unusual sound. The strong and brave, curious to know what the sound was, left their huts in a hurry with their spears and dogs and proceeded to the direction of the sound. It was not long before they caught sight of the biggest deer in the world. They set a strong trap near the south of the Magsungay creek because they believed that the deer must be very thirsty and they anxiously watched the trap. After a while they heard a faint rushing sound and it grew louder and louder and a few seconds later the biggest deer in the world was running towards the trap. The villages had a big feast that, since that time, people called the place "TANGAB" which means trap in English.

In April 26, 1962 the Bacolod City Council passed an Ordinance no. 117, an ordinance creating the Barrio of Tangub and its territorial jurisdiction and took effect on the first day of May 1962.

I. GENERAL DISCRPTION AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE BARANGAY

Geographical Location/ Boundaries:

Barangay Tangub is geographically located in the southern portion of Bacolod City. It is bounded by Guimaras Strait on the west, Barangay Singcang on the north, Barangay Alijis on the east by northeast, Barangay Mansilingan and Barangay Cabug on the Southeast, and Barangay Pahanocoy on the South. It is 4.7 km. from the City proper and almost 15-20 minutes ride.

Climate and Rainfall:

Barangay Tangub, as one of the Rural Barangay of Bacolod City, has two pronounced seasons, wet and dry season. The rainy season starts from June to January of the following year with heavy rains occurring during the month of February up to the last week of March, and January are the coolest month while April is the hottest. It registered 74.8 degrees Fahrenheit.

Demographic Data

The main demographic indicators used in studying population includes population size and growth rate, crude birth and mortality (death) rates, infant' s mortality rate, migration rate, sex ration and age distribution pattern. Birth, mortality, migration and population growth rate are expressed as proportions of the total population.

According to the 2005 census of National Statistics Office (NSO), Barangay Tangub has a population of 21,398. The recent survey for the year 2010 is 34,394. Based in the NSO figure of 2005 and 2010, the variance of 2,503 which 7.278% for every five (5) years growth rate.

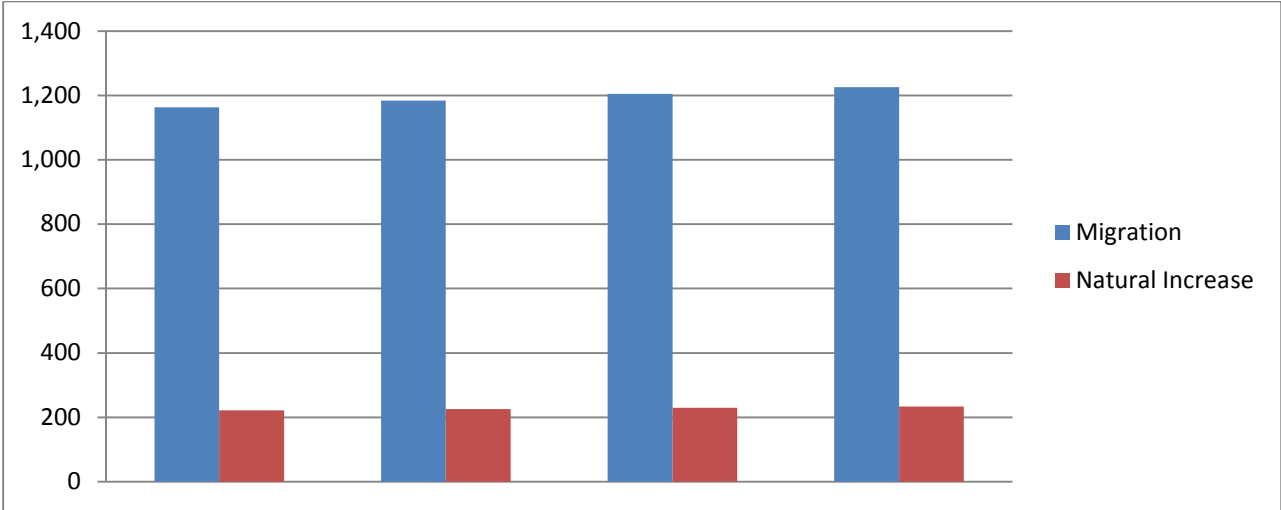

VI.5 Natural Increase against Migration



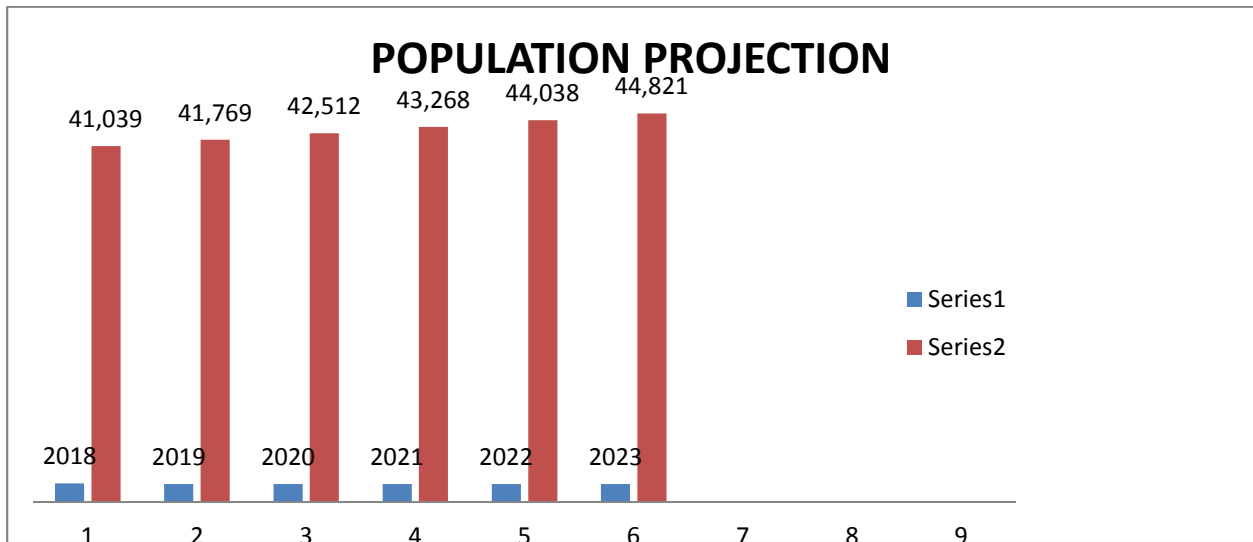

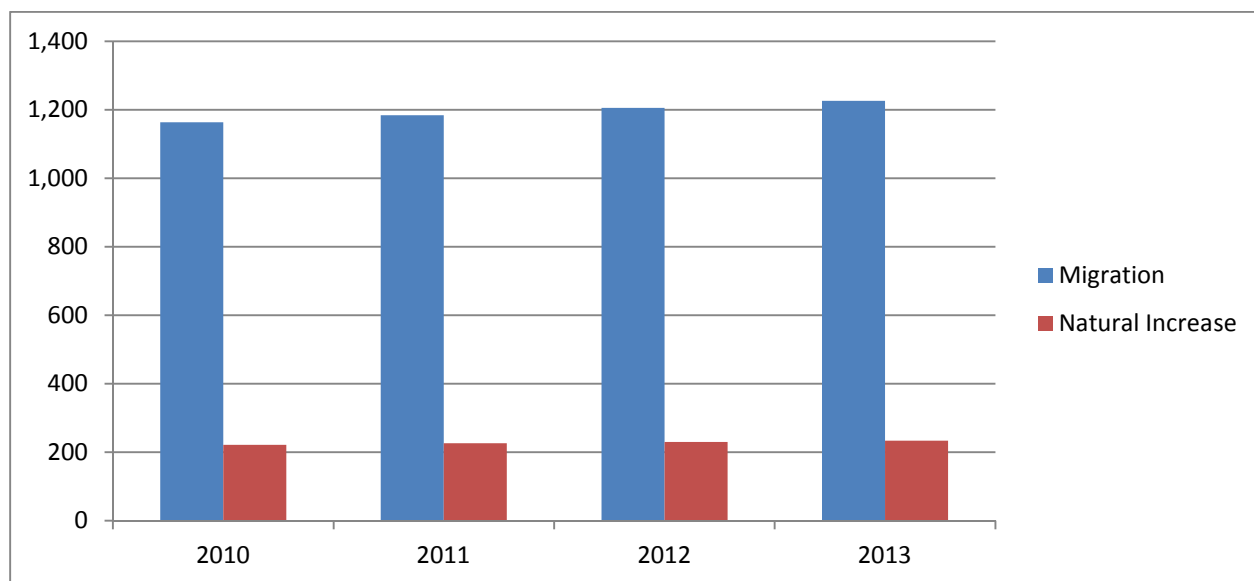

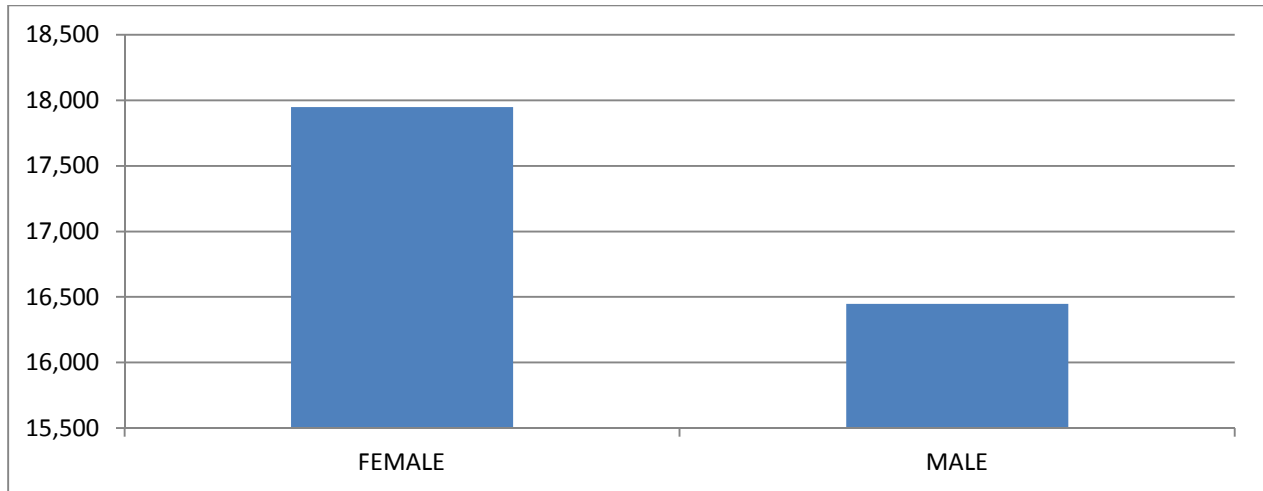
