VISION

A modern Barangay in which local governance focuses in developing a well-defined engine of growth on trade, commerce, business and industry as well as center for education with respect to all forms of religion and continuously improving the basic socio-economic-cultural programs, services and projects.

MISSION

To provide efficient and effective delivery of programs, services and projects where every citizen in the Barangay will have access to avail its opportunities and benefits.

HISTORY

Once a vast sprawling sugarcane fields formerly known as Hda. Mandalagan, it later became part of the large Montelibano holdings. Through sheer vision of the Grand Old Man, Don Alfredo Montelibano, Sr., a low-cost subdivision was opened with the sole purpose of giving opportunity to the less fortunate low-income group to acquire a lot and build a home of their own. Majority of the early residents were laborers and employees, thus it was then adequately and popularly known as Barrio Obrero.

Having the future of the community at heart and endowed with philanthropic attitude, the family donated large portions of their holdings for public use, on which stands now the People's Hall, University of St. La Salle, St Joseph's High School, Doña Corazon L. Montelibano Elementary School, Immaculate Conception Parish Church and a score of others.

Still through sheer vision of the grand old man and his enterprising sons, when the worst fire hit the City on April 1, 1954, the Capitol Shopping Center was established in 1955 which later became the heart of the barangay and the commercial the business center that led to the establishment of several more subdivision, among them the Montelibano, Gonzaga, Lopez, Miranda and Hervias Subdivision, and in a few years more subdivisions added and thousands of residential homes sprouted like mushrooms in the vicinity.

In 1961, Mr. Alfredo Montelibano, Jr. then administrator of the Capitol Subdivision, Inc., spearheaded a contest among residents, to change the name Barrio Obrero to a new one. From so many entries submitted, the name "**Villamonte**" was chosen by the judges and the lucky entry was that of Mrs. Teresita Infante Gensoli, a teacher of the St. Joseph's High School which earned her a prize of P 500.00.

On May 1, 1962 Villamonte became a chartered Barangay by virtue of City Ordinance No 114, as provided in Republic Act No. 2370 of 1959, otherwise known as An Act Granting Autonomy to Barrios of the Philippines, making Gervacio Mazo as the 1st Barrio Lieutenant. The law, however was revised and amended under Republic Act No. 3590 of 1964 and was the basis of the 1st nationwide Barrio election in which Rodolfo Javelona became the 1st Barrio Captain.

As Barangay Villamonte progresses, on April 2, 2002, Barangay Resolution No. 031, was passed and approved declaring that starting May 1, 2002 during the 40th Charter Anniversary of Villamonte and henceforth, the festivity shall be called Dinagyan Festival.

At present, “Republic of Villamonte” as it is being termed, is also considered as one of the most progressive and richest Barangay in terms of its Internal Revenue Allocation, share of its Real Estate Property Tax and local revenue allocation. It is also one of the biggest Barangay in terms of population, being the number 3 among the 61 Barangays.

BOUNDARIES

Barangay Villamonte has an area of 598.21 hectares. It is bounded in the north by Barangay Mandalagan, in the south by Barangay Taculing, in the east by Barangay Estefania, in the west by Barangay 20 & 23, southwest by Barangay 27 and 28, southeast by Vista Alegre & Barangay 41, and northwest by Barangays 5 & 7.

The land area is occupied by commercial and industrial buildings, educational and religious institutions and residential where 21 subdivisions and 36 puroks are situated. The residential portion has a total of 8,498 households and a total of 33, 454 population based on the 2019 survey conducted by the Barangay.

EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

Educational institutions also flourished in this Barangay. They are the University of St. La Salle, STI West Negros University, Colegio San Agustin Extension Campus and the Victory Business College, the latter specializing on Vocational Education and the former two on the academic field.

On the secondary and elementary levels cover St. Joseph School La Salle, Luis Hervias National High School, St. Rose of Lima School managed by the Dominican sisters, Doña Corazon L. Montelibano Elementary School, Alfredo Montelibano Elementary School, Maranatha Baptist Bible College and Living Stones International School. Further, there are 9 Day Care Centers that caters to children of pre-school age and with the SCOLA Guadalupana managed by the La Salle Sisters of Guadalupe Pre-school. The centers are supervised by DSSD and supported by the Barangay Villamonte Council.
