HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

In the early part of the twentieth century; most of the land area that is now the territory of Barangay Six was swampy and paddy; and it was entrenched by many different varieties of trees, most of them were coconut trees. Almost of the land area was owned by only few prominent families of Bacolod City. Almost a quarter part was owned by the Generoso Villanueva family; a fifth part was owned by Tan Juan Gonzaga family; almost a sixth part by Alfredo Montelibano Sr. family through Capitol Subdivision Inc.; the eight part by the Improgo family; the other quarter part was owned by the Lourdes Ciocon family; and the remaining parts or slices belong to different lot owners.

As time go by, the land that were once owned by these prominent families were subdivided and offered for sale. With the influx of many so journeys in the mid-20th century, they settled on a vacant areas, many of them are government employees. Years had passed, some had bought lots and until now still remain permanent residents of this barangay. And many others still remain as squatters and subject to be ejected anytime.

Here are the names of the puroks of Barangay 6 and its corresponding old name: Purok Macanpiña; before it was called Takas (Highland); Purok Magsanaya; before it was called Ubos (Lowland); Purok Azucena before it was called Rivera; Purok Masagana 99; it was called Jalandon; and Purok Piliit 1 and 2 was called Talamnan (Plantations); Purok Miracle; as Tangkongan or (Rice Paddy).

POPULATION AND DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE

Barangay 6 is situated about one kilometer North of Bacolod Public Plaza. It is located West of Barangay No. 4, along Gatuslao Street, North of Barangay No. 8, along North capitol road, East of Barangay No. 2, along San Juan Boulevard, and South of Barangay No. 3, along 17th Street.

Barangay 6 known as “TULAHAN” and composes of 5 puroks namely:

I. SECTORAL PROFILE

A. Social Sector

1.) Education

B. Economic Sector

Bacolod City is a highly Urbanized City. There are factories, foundry shop, bottling & brewery plant, many commercial stores & other swine flattering projects.

Barangay No. 6 however, has only one market but stand as a land mark for tourism. The Pala-pala Tulahan and Terminal for fish vendor. Soon to generate trisikad route around the Barangay to serve Barangay No. 6 constituents & additional source of income.

Regarding swine fattening & hog raising, it is no longer adaptable since it is residential zone.
