HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

It was the time of the Spanish regime, that Vista Alegre was just a barrio. It is just a sort of compound of the hacienda owned by Don Ignacio Coscolluela, comprising more than two hundred houses. Time passes by, the hacienda was divided among several persons, either by inheritance or by purchase which resulted to the decreased of number of household in the compound.

There was no record as to who has the first Teniente del Barrio of Vista Alegre. Being owned by Don Ignacio Coscolluela, it was presumed that he was the representative of the barrio to the Municipality of Bacolod.

As to its origin, Vista Alegre got its name from the merry-making celebrated by the folks and the beautiful view of the surroundings which you could view the sea from its wide fields. In other words, Vista Alegre means “Happy View”.

On May 1962, Barangay Vista Alegre was created through City Ordinance No. 108, as one of the Chartered Barangay of Bacolod City. The first Barangay Captain was the late Ramon Ceraspe, Sr., succeeded by Barangay Captain Loreto Peornato.

With the help of then Congressman Romeo G. Guanzon, Barangay Vista Alegre’s road was paved. Since Vista Alegre is composed of different haciendas with vast sugarcane plantation, it was branded as “The Sweet Farm” of Bacolod City. Presently, the barangay is composed of 26 Puroks and that caused the tremendous growth of its population. It has become a fast developing Barangay because of its “housing boom” from low cost to A Plus Housing Projects.

Little by little the vast sugarcane plantations had become the best subdivisions in the whole City of Bacolod.

VISTA ALEGRE’S NEW LEADERSHIP AND LANDSCAPE

In the year 2013 Barangay election, Vista Alegrehanons elected the grandson of Don Ramon B. Lacson, Sr., one of the Barangay’s patriarch to lead the hollow halls of the barangay. Under his watch, Punong Barangay Jose Maria Leandro Norberto Lacson De Leon’s “**KAP LINDY**” vision is to lead the Barangay to greater heights founded with the principle of utmost honesty and sincerity in public service.

It is the concern of every parent to send their children to school despite of the poverty they have experienced in their life. It is their aim though they are poor to send their children to school in order to be literate and become assets of society. Vista Alegre composed of the following schools. The Barangay through this administration had repeatedly filed various resolutions to for the construction of a Day Care Center at Purok Kasantolan, however up to this date there was no action from the City Government

PROTECTIVE SERVICES

Security is one of the major concerns of the Barangay fir his community by protecting them from any harm caused by the environment Barangay Vista Alegre had employed 20 tanod members who assist in maintaining peace and order in the Barangay. The Lupon Tagapamayapa and Bantay Bata in coordination with the Bacolod Police Station 7 and with the Purok Presidents help maintain peace and order in the Barangay. Despite of these foregoing forces in the Barangay, we still cannot avoid the following issues:

SOCIAL WELFARE

Since the Barangay is a service-oriented government agency, it is the main objective to provide an effective and efficient service for the welfare of its constituents or the community as a whole. Such service include housing, child protection, educational needs and health care.

There were 20 Barangay Health Workers and 1 Barangay Nutrition Scholar assisting the Health and Nutrition Programs of the Barangay. The City Health Department employed 1 Social Worker assigned in the barangay. There are 3 Day Care Workers (1 assigned at Purok Angela Hills, Purok Progreso and 1 at Barangay Proper).

For the spiritual enrichment of the people, the Barangay is composed of five (5) chapel/churches namely: Divine Mercy chapel, Our Lady of Peace & Good Voyage Church, San Antonio Padua Chapel, Vista Evangelical Church and Teofilo Gensoli Memorial Baptist Church.

HOUSING

Barangay Vista Alegre comprises of different haciendas owned by different landowners where most of the residents are living. Some of the residents were provided with free housing and some constructed their own house. One of the major housing project of the City is the relocation of informal settlers from different Barangays to Progreso Village I and II formerly known as the Abada-Escay and Arao Properties respectively.

There are 5 subdivisions located in Barangay Vista Alegre. These are:

SPORTS

The Barangay through its TASK FORCE ON YOUTH DEVELOPMENT conducted annual sports activity to enhance and develop the skills of the youth in the field of sports. The Barangay also had three (3) gymnasium as venue for sports activities which is located at Vista Alegre Proper, Vista Alegre Elementary School and Fernando Gonzaga Elem. School.

TRANSPORTATION

Barangay Vista Alegre has concrete paved barangay roads and the mode of transportation is the motorized tricycles of about 130 units plying the route from barangay proper to its neighboring sitios, puroks and haciendas. Taxi and PUJ are being utilized in case to case basis. Trucks are also used in hauling sugarcane from haciendas to the sugar central and vice versa.

Barangay Vista Alegre had purchase 1 tricycle and 2 multicabs to be used for emergency cases.

The Barangay also constructed footbridge at Purok Kawayanan, Kabugwason, Kasantolan 1 and Purok Kalubihan as a means of transportation of the residents.

There are four (4) associations of tricycles driver and operators, namely the Vista Alegre Tricycle Operators and Drivers Association (VATODA) and FFGVATODA., GRAVARSTODA and ARVISTODA.

WATER SUPPLY

Water is vital to humans. It is needed for food preparation, drinking, washing and irrigation. In addition, massive quantities are used daily in industrial process. Yet, it is a limited resource that must be collected and distributed with increasing care. It is the main concern of the Barangay to provide potable water to its community.

PROGRAMS/PROJECTS

1. Construction of artesian wells to the different puroks
2. Installation of pipe line from BACIWA to Barangay Proper
3. Installation of water system in the Barangay Hall.

POWER

Barangay Vista Alegre is well- provided with electricity by the CENECO. About 90% of the total populations are using electricity and 10% of it are

using lamps particularly those residents who are living in the remote area of the Barangay.

PROGRAMS/PROJECTS

1. Electrification program for those remote households.

ICT

With the advent of technology today, the barangay had acquired four (4) unit computer system for daily operations/activities. The means of communication in the Barangay is thru landline (PLDT and Globe lines), and Five (5) Units of Handset radio Transceiver, different types of cellular phones, two-way radio and televisions. Some residents particularly those who can afford, acquired smart bro or globe tattoo for internet connection.

SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

The Barangay Vista Alegre is a smoke-free zone because there is no factories located at the site. It is away from air pollution and water pollution, thus it is a “pollution-free” barangay. The Barangay conducted a tree planting activities and the barangay had developed a Mini- Forest at Vista Alegre Elementary School and consider this as one of the unique features of the barangay.

The segregation of garbage at source is an important aspect as waste management. This important activity reduces the amount of garbage going to landfill and is the most efficient and cost—effective way to separate valuable materials from the waste stream. Republic Act 9003 prohibits the collection of u-segregated waste by government units, however this aspect of the law is difficult to enforce without comprehensive household information and education campaigns (EIC).

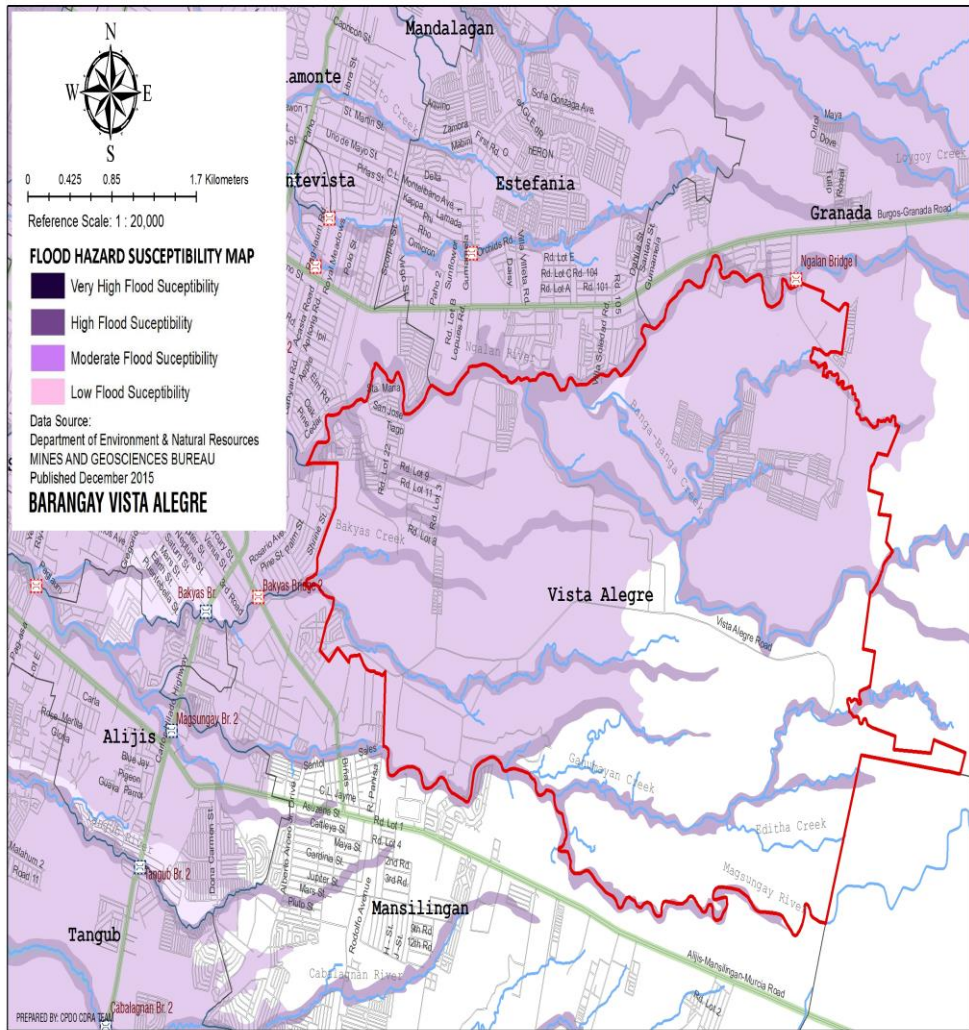
DRAINAGE AND SEWERAGE

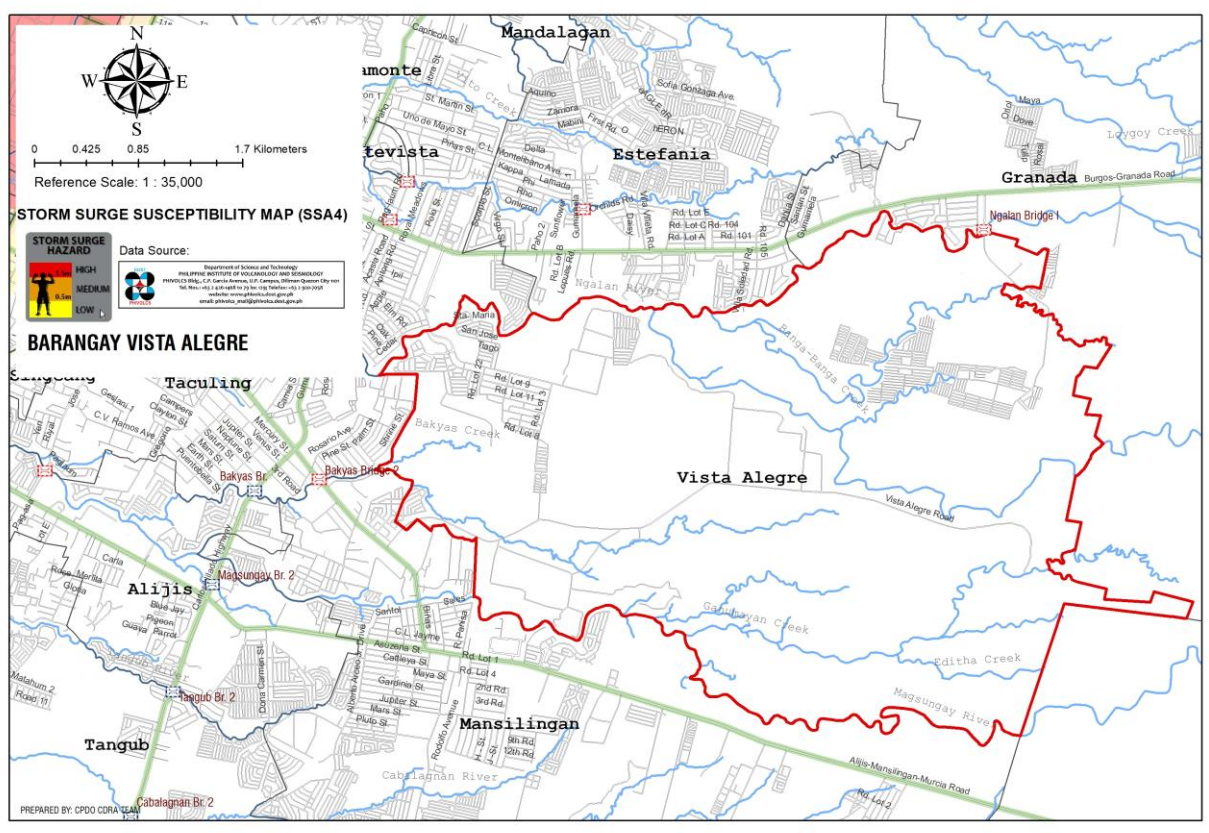
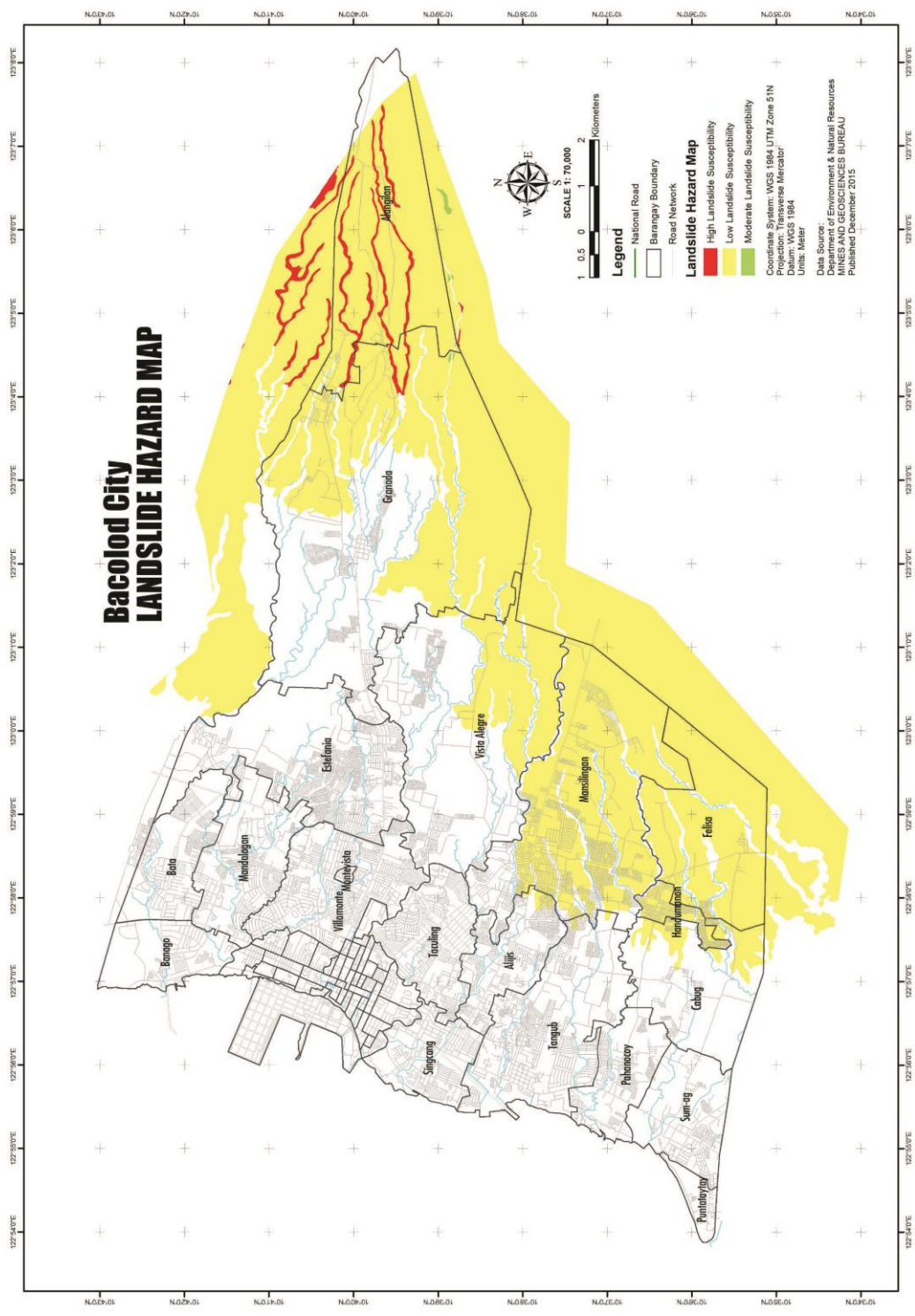
Drainage system may concern on the removal of surface or sub- surface water from a given area by natural or artificial means. The term is

commonly applied to the removal of excess water by canals, drains, ditches, culverts and other structures designed to collect and transport water either by gravity or by pumping. A drainage project may involve large scale reclamation and protection of marshes, underwater lands subject to frequent flooding.

The identified flood prone is for those who lives/resides along the river bank but in general, the Barangay is a “flood free” Barangay. This is because Barangay Vista Alegre has a good Drainage system. It has an open canal and the barangay never experience floods during heavy rains.

- 1.Regular maintenance of drainage system

BARANGAY FISCAL ADMINISTRATION

Fiscal Administration draws strength and rationality from the Constitutional provision of granting local government the power to create their own sources of revenue through local taxation.

In barangay administration, fiscal administration is primarily responsible for overseeing the financial and personnel needs of the barangay. Our purview includes staff compensation, barangay operating budgets, barangay development funds and internal revenue allotment.

Among others, these fiscal policies set the frameworks and procedures on local revenue generation that includes property tax administration, revenue ordinance codification as well as the operations of local economic enterprises. It also deals on the national government allotments, shares and subsidies.

Fiscal Administration involves revenue generation, the rational allocation, utilization and control of resources through the concept of performance budgeting by the local government units to optimize the use of public funds for the benefit of the greatest number of people.
