June 2, 1987

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 5, LETTER (b) OF ORDINANCE NO. 183, SERIES OF 1980.

Be it ordained by the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Bacolod in session assembled, that:

Section 1 - Section 5, letter (b) of Ordinance No. 183, Series of 1980 is hereby amended, so that as amended, the same shall read as follows:

Section 5.

- (b) The awardees of the kiosks are not allowed to sell the following items, to wit:

Meat, fish, fruits, (except "kalamunding"), vegetables, cooked food, such as linugao, linaga, or the like.

Section 2 - This ordinance shall take effect upon approval.





Gentlemen:

Herewith returned is your Ordinance No. 26, Series of 1987,
without action for the following reasons:

First, our legitimate vendors inside the Central Market are opposed to the exclusion of clothing from the amendatory ordinance. Copy of their petition which is self-explanatory is hereto attached for your perusal and evaluation.

Second, the amendatory ordinance runs counter to the intent of motive which spawned the passage of Ordinance No. 183, Series of 1980. Anent this observation, we would like to quote pertinent portions of the minutes of the deliberation of said Ordinance No. 183, Series of 1980, to wit:

"MEMBER JIMENEA - Mr. Chairman, while the explanation is laudable considering that what the proponent has previously said that he is apprehensive as to the viability and capability of the kiosk holders to pay the monthly rental, the question now - - what will prevent now the kiosk holder to sell there say, for instance, clothing and other finished products, T-Shirts and school supplies which for a small area like the kiosk, we cannot prevent the crowding of that area to such an extent that the problem of sidewalk vendors will again arise. But if we limit it only to chucherias, cigarettes, candies and peanuts, the space will be quite big and therefore, we can eliminate all sidewalk vendors in that area.

"MEMBER PARRENO - I agree with Member Jimenea that there should be a guideline even with respect to the City Mayor that we should be guided properly by the ordinance on how to implement the procedure on these awards. Now, I would like to ask

from the proponent to be specific on the items which cannot be sold in the stalls or in these kiosks. Instead of limiting the sale of items as proposed by Member Jimenea, we can instead list the items which cannot be sold.

"MEMBER ESTRELLA - I will agree on that Mr. Chairman if the Honorable Councilor Parreño will state the items which cannot be sold.

"MEMBER PARRENO - Precisely, I am throwing it to the proponent, Mr. Chairman, what items should not be sold.

"MEMBER ESTRELLA - Instead of naming the items that can be sold, we name the items which cannot be sold.

"MEMBER JIMENEA - I will go for that, Mr. Chairman. Therefore, I propose this amendment, "Provided, that the articles that cannot be sold are: meat, fish, clothing, school supplies, dry goods, vegetables, fruits..."

"MEMBER LEGASPI - Also cooked foods, Honorable Councilor, or "linogao" "batchoy" and "linaga".

In the light of the foregoing reasons, we request that the Honorable Sangguniang Panlungsod take a serious re-evaluation to the end of arriving at a conclusion that will be acceptable to the general public.
